The play is known for illuminating the constraints marriage imposed on women of the time.






Mexican Gothic

- Noemí is a young socialite enjoying parties in Mexico City when she is called on to visit the home of her newlywed cousin and find out what is going on. Her cousin has married an Englishman and lives with his family in a remote mansion called High Place.
- Once at High Place, Noemí is troubled by nightmares and by the odd behavior of her cousin's husband's family. They won't let her spend much time with her cousin, and they limit her activities. Noemí begins to fall under the spell of High Place and her cousin's husband.
- A work of post-colonial gothic horror, the story explores the legacy of colonization and exploitation that haunts us to this day.

The Great Gatsby

- ♦ F. Scott Fitzgerald's classic novel of the Jazz Age. Jay Gatsby is an incredibly wealthy man who seems to have it all. He throws lavish parties and entertains the spoiled rich people he longs to be accepted by.
- But Gatsby's real obsession is Daisy Buchanan, who is married to someone else.
- ♦ Told from the point of view of an outsider, Nick, this story offers a critique of the mindless pursuit of the American Dream.

Born a Crime: Stories from a South African Childhood

Trevor Noah, the host of *The Daily Show*, here recounts growing up as a mixed-race child in apartheid South Africa. Born to a white father and a black mother, Trevor's parents broke the law just by having him. His mother kept him hidden as a young child.

When apartheid ended, Trevor's mother sets out to make sure he has opportunities she never had.
